Well-managed grazing animals sustain ecosystems in which birds and mammals, plants, insects and other organisms thrive. Life is nurtured in pasture, trees, hedges and in the living soil beneath.

Our biodiversity case studies tell the story of over 25 of our farmers who raise their cattle and sheep wholly on pasture. Each case study is different, whether in terms of geology or climate, altitude or natural vegetation, size or topography, and they span the whole of the British Isles from Cornwall to Orkney and from Wales to Northern Ireland.

This is farming with nature, economically viable, producing nutrient-dense food. Through our biodiversity case studies, we highlight the vital role that grazing animals play in supporting nature and in its recovery.
