
Virtuous Cycle of Good Grazing



Good grazing practices lead to a beneficial, or virtuous, cycle for soil and plants.

Leaving plenty of residual leaf material allows the plant to still photosynthesise effectively.

This will lead to faster recovery and the longer rest periods will help increase biodiversity.

It will protect the soil, and maintain living roots in the soil that will work with the soil microbial and fungal life to build aggregates that in turn will improve water infiltration and storage.
