
Vicious Cycle of Poor Grazing



Poor grazing systems lead to detrimental, or vicious cycles, which damage plants and soil.

Plants that are grazed too frequently and too short for too many years may adapt by staying really short. Even when animals are removed, it may take months or even a couple of years to recover.

The soil and plants become unable to deal with adverse weather events such as drought and floods, through issues such as reduced water infiltration and less root growth.
